



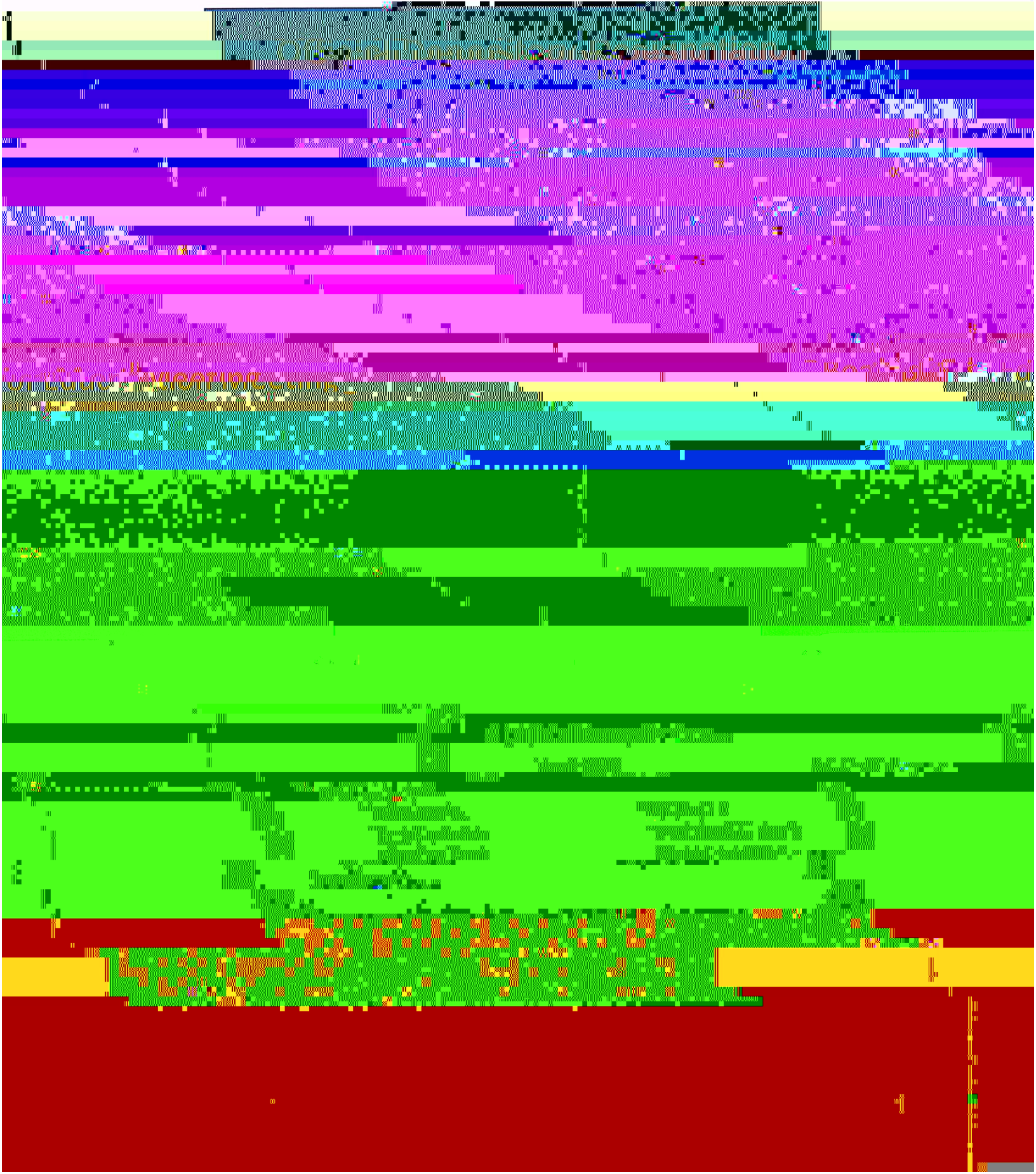
**Curriculum & Instruction Committee Report –September 9, 2024**

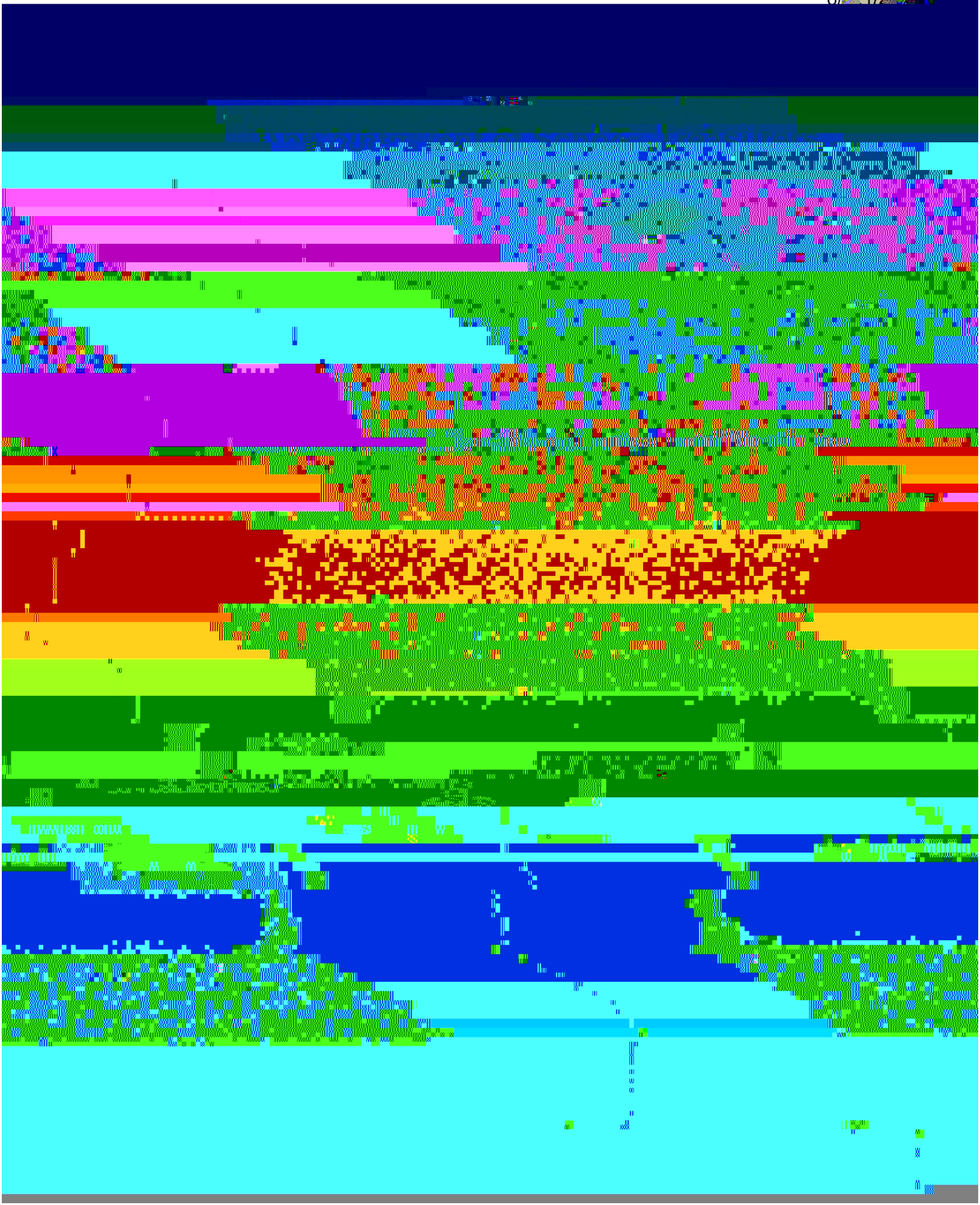

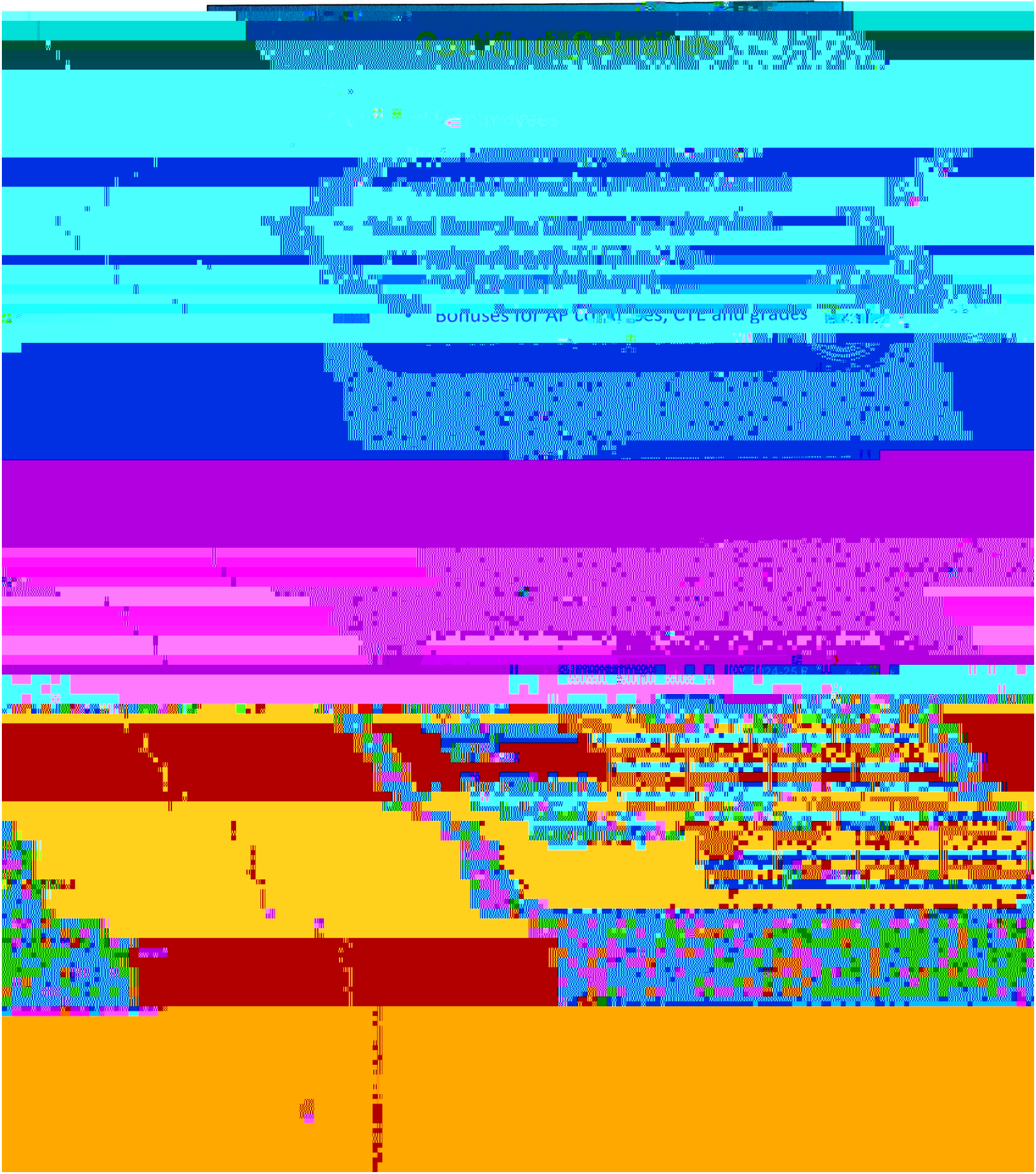
